Because of conflicting legal information, the College was not made aware until ayidhat Camosun is included in the Act. Reports must detail the steps taken during the previous financial year to prevent and reduce the risk that forced labour or child labour is used by them or in their supply chains. The first report was due on May 31, 2024, which has now pasted KPMG legal team was engaged to advise and compile the report, which is now complete. The report requires Board approval.

The repercussions of necrompliance with Federal legislation could be criminal liability and fines. An emergency meeting of the Board Executive Committee was called for June 3, 2024, immediately following Risk & Audit Committee, due to the urgency to committee the Federal legislation. The Executive Committee has the authority to act on behalf of the Board in emergencies.
